










Is "Somewhat" Using Data Good Enough Anymore?

The Role of Data in Course Scheduling

Where is the Data?

Course Offerings Misaligned with Student Demand

The classes I need aren't offered at a time that works with my schedule. I need to go to work.

I can't get into the course I need to take outside my program.

Why can't I get into the classes I need? They're always full.

Why are both the classes I need to take offered at the same time?

I don't have enough time to get to my classes that are located far apart.





- Used as an advertising tool




- Where students go to plan for upcoming and future terms

Inefficiencies Lengthen Time to Completion

Question: Would you say that there are course scheduling issues including bottlenecks, inefficiencies and course conflicts at your institution that can unnecessarily lengthen students' time to completion?



65%

of respondents report course scheduling issues significantly or somewhat impact students' time to completion



An All Too Common Culprit

The Impact of Manual Data Entry



Class Conflicts

Conflicting courses identified late must be cancelled or rescheduled



Students left scrambling to find new course or atrisk for delayed completion



Dual Grading Errors

Course advertised as dual grading, later changed to letter grade only



Students enroll for P/F in a course they aren't strong in, only to find out they will receive a letter grade



Variable Unit Errors

Course advertised with variable units, however only available for fixed number of credits

Students receive different number of credits than expecting, impacting progression or financial aid

How Have You Benefited?

Modernizing Academic Operations Gets Results



Less time spent on manual data entry (58%)



Decreased time to review, approve, and implement new curriculum (28%)



Fewer errors in the course schedule, curriculum, and/or catalog (51%)



Optimized course schedule that better aligns with student needs (28%)



More user-friendly experience when interacting with course scheduling, curriculum, catalog processes (48%)




New tools provided the time and capabilities to implement innovative practices (25%)




Half of Institutions Yet to Adopt

Question: Which aspect of academic operations at your institution is most in need of digital transformation to help you achieve your goals?



Metrics to Build a Student-Centric Schedule

Course distribution throughout day, week

Are a high percentage of courses clustered on certain days, between certain hours?

Course and section fill rates

What courses, sections are consistently at maximum capacity? At low capacity?

Enrollment data by academic program, course

Which program have seen an increase in enrollment?

A decrease in enrollment?

Time to completion by academic program

Which academic programs have higher rates of students not completing on time?

Enrollment trends by course modality

How have modality trends changed over time? How did the pandemic impact this data?

Time to completion by student segments

Which student groups take longer to complete programs? How might course access inhibit them?




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
